

No child should go hungry in America.

Today, 1 in 10 kids are facing hunger in Virginia.

No Kid Hungry is working to end childhood hunger by making sure every kid gets three meals a day.



HOW WE'RE HELPING END CHILDHOOD HUNGER

History of School Breakfast

- 1966 School Breakfast Program is established as a two-year pilot program through the Child Nutrition Act of 1966
- 1969 Free Breakfast for Children Program created in Oakland, California by the Black Panthers
- 1975 School Breakfast Program received permanent authorization nationwide, as well as the annual celebration of National School Breakfast Week



School Breakfast is Important!

Food Insecurity is a Health Issue



Food insecure children are sick more frequently, recover slowly, and are hospitalized more frequently.



Food insecurity and malnutrition can damage brain development.



66% of low-income families have to choose between buying food and paying for medicine each year.

Food Insecurity is an Education Issue



3 out of 4 public school teachers say that students regularly come to school hungry.



Standardized math scores increase by 17.5% on average when students regularly start the day with a healthy breakfast.



9 out of 10 teachers say they are concerned about the long-term effects that food insecurity has on children's education.

Research puts the cost of food insecurity to the U.S. economy at \$167.5 billion per year



Children facing food insecurity are more likely to drop out of school.



Summer food insecurity is linked to learning loss for children.



• 70% of eligible children to receive F/R meals participate in breakfast


• 90% of eligible children to receive F/R meals participate in lunch



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
CEP Expansion in Virginia SY22-23

Figure 1. Total Virginia SFAs Participating in CEP







Elimination of Reduced Price Meals in Virginia


- \$8.2 million to eliminate the reduced price meals category
- Supporting families whose incomes fall between 130% and 185% of the FPL
- Affecting roughly **64,500** students across Virginia!



Game #3: BREAKFAST BURRITO CLEAN UP






